Wayanad (Kerala): AICC General Secretary and United Democratic Front (UDF) candidate Priyanka Gandhi Vadra won the Wayanad Lok sabha seat byelection by a huge

margin of 4,08,036 votes on Saturday.

This was the maiden entry of Priyanka Gandhi to the Parliament and she also broke the record margin of her brother Rahul Gandhi who secured 3,64,422 votes in the election held to the Wayanad Lok Sabha constituency in April 2024. But in the 2019 Lok Sabha election, Rahul Gandhi won the Wayanad seat by a margin of 4.31 lakh votes.

BJP wins 5 seats in by-poll, SP lost seats

Lucknow: Ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) performed brilliantly and won seven seats In the byelections held on nine seats in Uttar Pradesh counting for which was held on Sunday, whereas the main opposition party Samajwadi Party (SP) had to be satisfied with only two seats, but the Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) could not even open its account.

In the last assembly elections, SP had won five of these nine assembly seats and four were with the BJP, but due to different reasons, in the by-elections held on these seats, this time the saffron brigade performed brilliantly and has waved the saffron flag on seven seats, while SP has had to be satisfied with only two seats. In these by-elections, the people have completely rejected BSP and its account could not even be opened.

In Ambedkar Nagar's Katehari seat, BJP candidate Dharmaraj Nishad got more than one lakh votes, while his opponent SP candidate Shobhavati Verma had to be satisfied with only 69,577 votes. BJP has won the Kundarki seat of Moradabad for the first time by giving a historic performance.



Party candidate Ramveer Singh got 1,64,585 votes from here while SP candidate Rizwan Ahmed could get only 24,355 votes. Saffron flag has been hoisted for the first time on this Muslim dominated seat.

Mithlesh Pal, candidate of Rashtriya Lok Dal, a constituent of BJP alliance NDA, has won from Meera-



pur seat and defeated SP candidate Sumbul Rana by a margin of about 30,000 votes.

BJP candidate Deepak Patel has won from Phulpur seat by a margin of 11,305 votes from his nearest rival SP candidate Mutjba Siddiqui. BJP candidate Deepak Patel got 78,289 votes in the last round of counting while

Siddiqui had to be satisfied with a total of 66,984 votes.

The BJP candidate won the Khair seat of Aligarh by giving a tremendous performance. BJP candidate Surendra Diler got 1,0181 lakh votes while SP candidate Charu Kain could get only 61,788 votes.

In the Majhawan seat, BJP candidate Suchismita Maurya got 77,737 votes while SP nominee Dr Jyotibind got only 72,815 votes. In this way, BJP waved the flag of victory on this seat too.

In the Ghaziabad seat, BJP candidate Sanjeev Sharma defeated SP's Singhraj Jatav. While the BJP candidate got 96,946 votes, Jatav had to be satisfied with only 27,959 votes.

SP could save only Karhal seat, which is considered its stronghold, and Sisimau seat. From Karhal seat, SP's Tej Pratap Yadav defeated his nearest rival BJP's Anuj Yadav by 14,704 votes. Tej Pratap Yadav got 1,04,207 votes, while Anuj Yadav got 89,503 votes.

Naseem Solanki got 69,714 votes in Sisamau seat while his nearest rival BJP's Suresh Awasthi could get only 61,150 votes.

Feeble western disturbance hits Kashmir, bring light snowfall in upper reaches

Srinagar: A feeble western disturbance brought light snowfall in upper reaches of Kashmir on Saturday, officials said.

Meteorological Department Srinagar centre's director Mukhtar Ahmad said the tourist resort hotspots like Sonamarg in central Kashmir's Ganderbal district, the upper reaches of Gulmarg and other hilly areas experienced light snowfall. Ahmed said some plains received light rains in Kashmir on Saturday and the weather is likely to remain wet till Sunday. Earlier, the Kashmir Valley witnessed a marginal rise in night temperatures.

The summer capital Srinagar recorded a minimum temperature of 2.5°C, marking an improvement from earlier sub-zero levels. Just a day earlier, the city had experienced its coldest night of the season at -1.2°C.

Similarly, other stations across the valley also recorded an uptick in temperatures.

According to the MeT, the ski resort of Gulmarg in north Kashmir was the only location to remain below freezing, with a night temperature of -0.5°C. The hill resort of Pahalgam in south Kashmir registered a minimum of 3.2°C, while Kupwara in north Kashmir recorded 2.1°C. The Meteorological Department has predicted that night temperatures are likely to fall by 2-3°C in the coming days.

Meanwhile, in the Jammu division, the Jammu city recorded a minimum temperature



of 12.4 degrees, Katra 11, Batote 6.5, Baniha. 5.2 and Bhaderwah 3.2.

The Kashmir region is set to witness a mix of weather conditions over the coming days, with light rain and snowfall in higher reaches expected.

According to the MeT, the region will experience cloudy skies and light precipitation on November 24 and December 1, while the rest of the period is likely to remain dry.

"Generally cloudy with light rain or light snow in higher reaches is expected at isolated places till forenoon of November 24," the MeT forecast said.

It said light rain and snowfall in higher altitudes are anticipated from the late night of November 30 to the morning hours of December 1. The weather is to remain dry between December 2-5, MeT said.

Beirut: At least 11 people were killed and 63 others injured on Saturday in an Israeli airstrike at dawn targeting a residential building in Lebanon's capital Beirut, the Lebanese Health Ministry reported. The explosions destroyed an eightstory building and caused heavy damage to neighboring buildings. Civil defense teams are still working on searching for victims under the rubble. Israeli media outlets reported that the airstrike was aimed at a prominent Hezbollah official. Hezbollah has not commented on the incident. Since Sept. 23, the Israeli army has intensified its air attack on Lebanon in an escalation of conflict with Hezbollah.



Jharkhand: INDI alliance on course to a massive win

stellar show from its spearhead JMM, the ruling I.N.D.I.A bloc seemed on course to retain power in Jharkhand with a massive two-thirds majority, leaving the BJP-led NDA far behind in the vote count for the state's Assembly polls on Saturday.

Of the total 81 seats in the state Assembly, I.N.D.I.A bloc has either won or is in the lead in 56 seats. In contrast, the main opposition Bharatiya Janata Party-led National Democratic Alliance has either won or continues to be ahead of rivals in only 24 constituencies.

The Jharkhand Loktantrik Krantikari Morcha, fighting its maiden election, has won the in Dumri seat.

As per the Election Commission website at 7 p.m., the JMM has already bagged 23 seats, besides being ahead of rivals in 11 more, and could expect to pick up 34 seats if the trends hold. Considering the party contested 41 seats, it makes for a formidable strike rate of over 82 percent.

JMM's alliance partners Congress (11 wins plus five leads) and Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD - two wins and two leads) were in sight of 16 and four seats respectively, while

dia (Marxist-Leninist) Liberation have triumphed in two seats.

Among the NDA constituents, the BJP could end up with 21 seats, having already picked up 15 seats with leads in half a dozen more. The Janata Dal-United (JD-U) and Lok Janshakti Party(Ram Vilas) were in the lead in one constituency

Chief Minister and top JMM leader Hemant Soren. who led the I.N.D.I.A campaign, completed a hatrick of wins from Barhait, having earlier coasted to victory from the seat in the 2014 and 2019 polls. Soren, who maintained a steady lead since the counting began at 8 a.m, won with a 39791 margin over his BJP opponent Gamliyel Hembrom.

The 49-year-old leader, who happens to be the eldest son of JMM founder Shibu Soren, has been helming the state since 2019, albeit with a five-month break earlier this year, when he was arrested for alleged corruption.

There was further good news for the JMM and Hemant as the afternoon advanced as his wife Kalpana Soren and brother Basant seized the lead from Gandey and Dumka constituencies



respectively after falling behind in the initial rounds.

With the counting over, Kalpana was ahead of BJP's Muniya Devi by almost 17,000 votes. The result is yet to be officially announced.

According to the EC website, Basant Soren defeated BJP nominee Sunil Soren by 14588 votee.

Among other prominent JMM nominees, Assembly Speaker Ravindra Nath Mahto was leading from

After a day-long snake and ladder game, veteran politician Louis Marandi, who jumped ship to JMM after severing his long association with the BJP just before the poll, prevailed over the challenger from her former party Suresh Murmu by 5738 votes in Jama.

On the NDA side, overcoming initial hiccups, former state Chief Minister Champai Soren, who contested as a BIP nominee from Seraikella, won by a 20477 margin over her JMM rival Ganesh Mahali.

Bihar byelection: NDA makes clean sweep winning all four assembly seats

Patna: NDA made a clean sweep on Saturday winning all the four assembly seats in the byelection, making it tough for Grand Alliance in the next Bihar assembly election slated for 2025 as RJD had accepted it as semifinal of next major electoral battle of the state.

NDA won all four seats

of Tarari, Ramgarh, Imamganj and Belaganj while Grand Alliance, earlier holding three seats, scored zero. candidates Prashant and Ashok Kumar Singh won Tarari and Ramgarh seats respectively while JD(U) candidate Manorama Devi and HAM candidate Deepa Manjhi won Belaganj and Imamganj Belaganj and Ramgarh

seats were earlier held by RJD while Tarari seat was held by CPI (ML). Imamganj seat seat was held by HAM, a partner of ruling NDA in Bihar.

Grand alliance was in upbeat mood with its satisfactory results of nine seats in 2024 Lok Sabha election and RJD had dubbed assembly by-election in four seats as semi final of 2025 Bihar assembly election.

Court suggests first

tree census for Delhi New Delhi: In response to the alarming rate of tree felling in Delhi, which Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) data indicates is five trees per hour, the Supreme Court announced on Friday its intention to mandate a tree census for the city-the first of its kind. Additionally, the court plans to establish an expert committee to oversee and approve any tree felling activities. A bench comprising Justices A. S. Oka and Augustine George Masih stated they would outline strict criteria for tree felling and introduce an extra layer of scrutiny through this expert panel to prevent illegal activities. This committee, to be appointed by the Supreme Court, will have the final authority on tree felling decisions, requiring its mandatory approval after various government departments give their initial consent. The court also agreed with senior advocate ADN Rao's suggestion that local Station House Officers (SHOs) should be held personally accountable for any unauthorized tree cutting. Furthermore, the census is proposed to extend to the protected Taj Trapezium Zone in Agra. The bench emphasized the necessity of a tree census and the establishment of a vigilant mechanism to prevent illegal tree felling. The Supreme Court was hearing a petition demanding a complete ban on tree felling in the city without the court's permission, which currently applies only to forest trees. The petitioner cited MCD data revealing that from 2019 to 2021, a total of 1,33,117 trees were sanctioned for felling across all categories, averaging 44,372 trees annually, or five trees every hour. Highlighting allegations that various authorities, responsible under the (DPTA), had failed in their duties, leading to a reduction in Delhi's green cover, the court decreed that no trees would be cut without the panel's approval. After brief respite, air quality slips back to 'very poor' in Noida & Ghaziabad

Noida: After a brief respite, the region's air quality deteriorated to the 'very poor' category again on Thursday. Noida and Ghaziabad both witnessed a 'poor' AQI day on Thursday for the first time in eight days. On Thursday, however, AQI rose in both cities with Noida recording AQI of 318 while Ghaziabad stood at 303. Greater Noida remained in the 'poor' category at 266, compared to 212 the day before. Air monitoring stations in both districts recorded air quality levels ranging from 'poor' to 'very poor'.In Noida, the Sector 62 station recorded the worst AQI at 357, followed by Sector 1 (313) both in the 'very poor' cat-

Pets, street animals suffer as pollution levels rise in Delhi

pollution levels in Delhi are severely impacting pets and street animals, leading to numerous health complications and behavioral changes, according to veterinarians. Pet owners and animal welfare advocates have raised alarms as many animals exhibit respiratory issues such as coughing, sneezing, chest congestion, vomiting, and diarrhea. Experts link these problems to the city's deteriorating air quality. Sumit Nagar, a consult-

ing veterinary doctor with

the Delhi Forest and Wildlife Department, notes an increase in respiratory distress among animals. Animals suffer from health issues similar to humans, including suffocation, lung damage, and respiratory inflammation. Diwali brings additional challenges like noise pollution shock and burns, particularly for monkeys that encounter wires.Pet owners are limiting outdoor activities to shield their pets from the polluted air, leading to behavioral problems like pent-up energy and aggression in dogs.

"The morning smog makes it difficult to walk my dogs. They cough and vomit due to the toxic air," said Sujata Bhattacharya, a Pitampura resident. "Since masks aren't an option for them, we've cut down on outdoor time, but this has made them more aggressive. Dogs need outdoor activities to expend energy,



but even bathroom breaks expose them to harmful air," she added.

Cat owners report their pets suffering from eye irritation and sneezing, with many cats avoiding outspaces. Ranjana Mukherjee, a pet owner from Gurugram, mentioned that her three cats have been sneezing and experiencing eye irritation. She observed that her cats have stopped going outside, which is unusual for them, and seem lethargic due to the current condi-

Street animals face even graver challenges. Smoggy mornings and nights with poor visibility have led to more hit-andrun incidents, according to animal activists. "Low visibility makes driving dangerous, and street animals often fall victim to accidents. They lack shelter or protection, making them vulnerable," said Kanika Diwan, an animal welfare activist.Feeding street animals has also become more difficult. "The number of feeders has

'Shocking' State Of Affairs At Chandni Chowk, Says HC

Politics of the Adani Issue

Famous industrialist Gautam Adani and his conglomerate are once again in the limelight. While Adani has been in the news in Maharashtra due to Dharavi, he has now also been in the news internationally. Gautam Adani has been accused of allegedly defrauding investors in the US and bribing government officials. The US Securities and Exchange Commission has accused Gautam Adani and some of his associates of defrauding investors. Warrants have also been issued against Gautam Adani and his nephew Sagar Adani and his associates in this case. The Congress has become aggressive over this and has reiterated its demand for the formation of a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) to investigate the Adani case. While the opposition in India is aggressive over this, the US has assured that a way out can be found.

Adani is accused of paying \$235 million in bribes to Indian officials to get solar power projects in India. The country's industries and their shares have fallen sharply after the US action against Adani. In this context, White House Press Secretary Karin Jean-Pierre told reporters at a press conference that the administration is aware of the allegations made against Adani. However, she assured everyone that the relationship between India and the US is strong and that we are confident that we will be able to resolve this issue like any other issue, considering that our relations will not be affected.

The US Department of Justice has raised questions about Adani and his role in this fraud case. While the Adani Group has suffered a major setback due to this, an international contract of the Adani Group has also been cancelled. Kenyan President William Ruto has taken a hasty decision and cancelled the plan to expand his country's main airport. Adani had bid the highest for this project. The Kenyan government has announced the cancellation of the airport expansion and power transmission contract with the Adani Group. The cancellation of this project contract worth nearly Rs 6,000 crores will be a big blow to the Adani Group. The shares of Adani Group companies have fallen sharply in the Indian stock market. Here, the Adani Group has immediately issued a statement regarding the alleged bribery case in the US, saying that all these allegations are unacceptable. All the allegations made by the US Department of Justice against the directors of 'Adani Greens' are baseless and we reject all those allegations. As stated by the US Department of Justice itself, the crimes filed in such cases are only allegations until they are proven. Also, until then, the accused concerned is innocent. We are investigating all possible legal aspects in this case, the Adani Group said in this statement.

Opposition parties are demanding his arrest here in the country. Opposition leaders criticized that Adani has the protection of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, so he is safe. The truth or falsehood of the allegations made against Adani will be known only after the actual court proceedings. The information given by the US Department of Justice in the charge sheet has not yet been fully disclosed. However, information is coming to light that some states in India have been named in this charge sheet. It is reported that bribes worth about Rs 2,000 crore were offered to get the opportunity to set up such power generation projects in states like Odisha, Tamil Nadu, Chhattisgarh and Andhra Pradesh. It is important to note that this case dates back to 2021 to 2022. It is also important to note that during this period, all these four states belonged to the opposition parties that are now accusing and criticizing Adani and Prime Minister Narendra Modi through him. The leaders who allege that Adani's alleged financial irregularities have the support of Prime Minister Narendra Modi should take this matter into special consideration. Because, it is not possible for an industrial group to get such contracts in their state without the consent of the Chief Ministers of the opposition parties. Therefore, it should not be forgotten that while pointing one finger at Prime Minister Narendra Modi, three fingers of the same hand are pointed at the leaders who are making the allegations. This is not an attempt to take Adani's side or to declare him innocent. Legal action has now been initiated against him in the US and the truth regarding it will come out as soon as possible. But, once such issues are politicized, the question of political morality also arises. When investigative agencies like ED, CBI etc. raid opposition party leaders in India or seize their assets considered unaccounted for, isn't the same issue of 'political morality' raised by the opposition parties? The question is asked, how does the ED find only opposition party leaders to raid? It is being said that action is being taken against the leaders of the opposition parties out of a sense of 'witch hunting' or political vendetta. Then, why are the same opposition parties silent on the Adanis with whom the states where the opposition parties are in power have done business, and why is only Prime Minister Narendra Modi being targeted in this regard, are these questions not also related to political correctness and impartiality? After all, the fact that the line 'ours is ours and others are ours' is an important reality in the politics of our country. It is also fair to ask whether the then Chief Ministers of the states where this alleged bribery by Adani was taking place twothree years ago did not notice this matter, and why did they not take action against the Adanis or against their own officials who allegedly accepted bribes from them. If no such action has been taken, then many issues arise such as whether someone would accept the allegation that these Chief Ministers had also protected Adani. This attitude has become 'cover up your own and show others' openly'. If Adani has committed any wrongdoing, then strict action should be taken against him in India, this demand is not at all wrong. However, one hand does not clap. Therefore, it is clear that the wrongdoing cannot take place unless Adani and many state governments, their officials and the policy makers of those states are also involved in such transactions. Then, it would be right and more credible to demand

that an inquiry should be made, but that it should be

conducted in a comprehensive and impartial manner.



Haryana's PWD (B&R) fined Rs 10L for exacerbating pollution

Gurugram: As air quality concerns in the National Capital Region reach a critical point, with daily judicial monitoring by the Supreme Court, the Haryana Government's Public Works Department (B&R) is facing scrutiny for its failure to comply with environmental regulations and its involvement in air pollution violations.

The Haryana State Pollution Control Board (HSPCB) on Friday imposed a hefty fine of Rs 10 lakh on the Public Works Department (B&R) of the state government for contributing to air pollution by neglecting environmental regulations and allowing dust emissions on a poorly maintained road near SGT University on the Dhankot-Badali highway on the outskirts of Gurugram city. Regional Officer of the HSPCB, Nirmal Kumar Kashyap, and senior scientist Vikas Grewal, who visited the site, found that dust was being emitted due to vehicle movement on the unpaved road. The PWD (B&R) had failed to take any measures to control the air pollution. Since the implementation of Stage-4 of the

Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP) by the district administration, the PWD (B&R) was expected to sprinkle water and adopt all necessary measures to control dust pollution, but no action had been taken.

According to the orders issued by Kashyap and Grewal, "Huge loose dust is found on the road without compaction, resulting in large clouds of dust being emitted as vehicles pass, worsening the already severe air quality in the region and endangering public health."
The orders further stated, "The minimum measure of sprinkling water has not been carried out..."The HSPCB added, "The unmaintained road is emitting dust into the atmosphere, creating a hotspot for dust pollution, violating the GRAP Stage-4 guidelines and posing a serious risk to public health."In light of these violations and the ongoing severe environmental conditions, the HSPCB directed the Superintending Engineer of the Gurugram Circle, PWD (B&R), to deposit an environmental compensation of Rs 10,00,000 with the HSPCB.

Kurukshetra: In a significant ruling, the Punjab and Haryana High Court has upheld the validity of the Haryana Municipal (Amendment) Act, 2018, and the Haryana Municipal (Second Amendment) Act, 2019, which empowered the State Election Commission (SEC) to remove municipal presidents and members on grounds of statutory disqualification.

Dismissing a writ petition challenging the provisions, the Bench of Justice Sureshwar Thakur and Justice Sudeepti Sharma court reaffirmed the legislative competence of the Haryana State Legislative Assembly to enact such laws under the constitutional framework

The petitioner, an elected president of a municipal committee, had sought to declare the amendments null and void.

Arguing they violated constitutional provisions, including Article 243V, and the Supreme Court's decision in the case of 'NP Ponnuswami versus the Returning Officer'.

The petitioner further challenged a show-cause notice issued by the SEC, claiming procedural violations and non-adherence to the principle of natural justice.

The Bench ruled that the amendments were constitutionally valid and fell squarely within the legislative competence of the State

Article 243V explicitly allowed state legislatures to create laws prescribing disqualifications for municipal members and designate an authority to decide such matters.

The court emphasised that the SEC's empowerment to decide on disqualifications was in harmony with this constitutional mandate.

The judgment further clarified petition.

Any grievances about procedural lapses, the court said, would be addressed in that case.

The court's decision is significant as it upholds the SEC's jurisdiction to adjudicate disqualifications.

Under the amended Act, emphasising that legislative measures aimed at maintaining democratic integrity must be respected.

"The impugned legislation is made with the completest wisdom of fullest legislative empowerment," the judgment stated.

Constitutional principle that once elections are concluded, disputes regarding disqualifications must be decided through designated statutory mechanisms rather than judicial interference

State legislatures have the authority to create bodies and mechanisms to address such electoral issues within their jurisdiction.

Shortage of doctors, paramedics ails healthcare in Panipat

Panipat: The tall claims of the state government of providing quality health services to residents notwithstanding, there is an acute shortage of doctors and paramedics in the district.

The 200-bed Bhimsen Sachar Civil Hospital, which caters to a population of 14 lakh at the district headquarters, has 24 doctors against the sanctioned strength of 55. Chief Minister Mano-

har Lal Khattar had inaugurated the new building of the hospital on Haryana Day in 2019, and it was upgraded to 200 beds from 100 beds. However, patients have to face a lot of problems in the absence of doctors and technical staff.

As per information, the post of Principal Medical Officer (PMO) has been lying vacant for the past many months. A total of 28 doctors are posted in the hospital, including 24



medical officers, two senior medical officers (SMOs) and two deputy medical superintendents (DMS). Three dental surgeons are working at the hospital

About 1,500 to 2,000 patients visited the Civil Hospital daily, while 25 to 30 deliveries are done daily. As many as 70-80 pa-

tients are admitted to the hospital every day, sources said. Similarly in Samalkha, the 50-bed Civil Hospital is also facing an acute shortage of doctors. The hospital has a sanctioned strength of 11 doctors, but only five are posted there and there is no specialist.

In November 2023,

former CM Manohar Lal Khattar had made an announcement to upgrade the Civil Hospital to 100 beds. As per data of the Health Department in the district, six posts of deputy civil surgeon is lying vacant against the sanctioned strength of nine; nine SMOs are posted against the sanctioned

strength of 16; 97 medical are working against the strength of 147; 11 posts of lab technician against the sanctioned strength of 46; 19 pharmacists working against the sanctioned posts of 41; and 10 radiographers are working against 15 sanctioned posts. There is no dental assistant-cum-mechanic in the district. The government had also announced plans to provide better health facilities like MRI, Cath Lab, CT scan, haemodialysis and blood bank to patients. The CT scan and haemodialysis facility is being run on PPP mode. The blood bank was started in May — after five years of the announce-

ment—the sources stated.

Surgeon, said, "We have
been asking the government for more doctors on a
regular basis. The recruitment process of 766 doctors is under way at the
government level."

Medical college to come up in Palwal, panchayat transfers 47 acres

Palwal: The Pelak village panchayat here has transferred over 47 acres for the setting up of the first medical college and hospital in the district. Work on the detailed project report (DPR) is likely to be taken up soon by the Department of Medical Education and Research (DMER). With the lease deed for transferring the land to the DMER recently, the process of setting up the first medical college and hospital has been set into motion, according to officials of the district administration. "The land was leased by the panchayat to the DMER for 33 years on November 14," said an official.

This has paved the way for setting up the medical institution that had been announced over two years ago. He said the availability of land had been a major issue and it got resolved a few months ago when the district administration identified the land which could be transferred without any major hitch. The project could have hit a hurdle if the govern-



ment had to acquire private/farmers' land, as the consensus of owners was vital.

Deputy Commissioner Harish Vashisht said while the land for the medical college had been transferred, the DMER had to start the process of preparation of the DPR and release of tenders. 13K farmers register for incentive under crop residue management in Karnal

Karnal: A total of 13,306 farmers in Karnal district have registered for crop residue management on 1,42,598 acres, demonstrating their commitment to sustainable agricultural practices

The state government, under its initiative to combat stubble burning and promote eco-friendly practices, is offering an incentive of Rs 1,000 per acre to farmers adopting these measures.

Farmers have expressed enthusiasm for ex-situ management, with 8,842 farmers registering to manage paddy stubble on 98,087 acres. Exsitu management involves the removal of crop residue for use in alternative applications such as biofuel production. Notably, 2,154 farmers have registered to supply stubble from 21,703 acres to the 2G ethanol plant, a step toward reducing stubble burning and promoting renewable energy. As per the officials, in-situ management, which focuses on incorporating the stubble into



agement machines, has also gained grip. A total of 2,466 farmers have registered under this system, covering 22,807 acres.

The last date of the regis-

The last date of the registration is November 30 and the department will start verification of the claims of the farmers after the completion of registration. Dr Wazir Singh, Deputy Director Agriculture (DDA), appreciated the efforts of farmers for adopting in-situ and ex-situ management systems. He

emphasised the importance of such measures in reducing pollution.

"Farmers of the district have showed enthusiasm in adopting stubble management system, which helps in reducing stubble burning cases. The district has recorded a fall of nearly 25 per cent of cases in comparison to the last season," the DDA said. He said that this season, the district recorded 93 cases of stubble burning while last year till November 21, the district recorded 122 cases.

Kochi: A long-standing and fascinating southern rivalry will reawaken when Kerala Blasters FC and Chennaiyin FC go against each other at the Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium here in the Indian Super League (ISL) match on Sunday, at 7:30 pm IST.

Both teams have played eight matches thus far, with Chennaiyin FC placed fourth thanks to three wins and Kerala Blasters FC positioned 10th with two wins and draws each to their name.

Given the slender difference in the number of victories they have garnered thus far, things could change pretty quickly in the standings and both teams will be cautious of ceding any ground, particularly to begin the post international break phase on a strong footing.

Chennaiyin FC have notched 16 goals, which is their highest such tally after eight games in any season. Their goal difference of +4 is the second-best at this stage after 2017-18, when it was +5. They have averaged 25.3 touches inside the opposition's box per game in the current campaign, which shows their relentless pursuit of finding breakthroughs past their defensive unit.

their defensive unit.

Chennaiyin FC had won their most recent match against Kerala Blasters FC by 1-0 in February 2024. It was a remarkable feat since they had been winless in their last seven encounters against the Kochi-based team. Now, they will be chasing back-to-back triumphs against this opposition for the first time since



2019-20. Kerala Blasters FC

have netted in each of their last 15 home games. A strike in the coming match will equal the longest goalscoring run at home by any side in competition's history alongside Bengaluru FC (January 2018 to March 2019), Chennaiyin FC (November 2016 to October 2018) and Delhi Dynamos FC (October 2015 to December 2016). This fact shows that they always believe in taking the game to the opposition when playing in their backyard. Kerala Blasters FC

have conceded the most penalties (5) in ISL 2024-25, whereas Chennaiyin FC follow them closely (4) in this regard. This does suggest that the scales of the encounter could tilt in either team's favour through their performance and composure from the spot.

Kerala Blasters FC head coach Mikael Stahre said that his team needs to fix some defensive issues, but highlighted an impor-

tant issue that might have slipped under the radar too.

"We have conceded too many goals (16) and we need to find a solution for that. But, it's not like we've conceded too many chances, so that helps, as it would have been worse had we conceded a lot of goal-scoring opportunities as well," Stahre said.

Chennaiyin FC head

coach Owen Coyle expressed his gratitude towards the supporters of Chennaiyin FC who will be travelling for the match against Kerala Blasters FC in Kochi.

"There are a few hun-

"There are a few hundred fans who will be coming for the away game against Kerala Blasters FC. We are thankful for them since they support us everywhere we go. We want to put a smile on their faces and we can do that by winning this difficult game," Coyle said.

The two teams have played 22 games against each other in the ISL, with Kerala Blasters FC and Chennaiyin FC winning six and seven encounters respectively. Nine matches have resulted in a draw.

Chennaiyin FC's Connor Shields has been in incredible creative touch off late, producing the leaguebest 34 goal-scoring opportunities – which is 15 more than the next best (19) tally by Greg Stewart in this metric. Shields has also logged in four assists

so far this season.
With three goals and assists each, Kerala Blasters FC's Adrian Luna is one away from surpassing Rafael Crivellaro (2 goals & 4 assists) as the player with most goal contributions in this fixture. Luna has directly contributed to a goal in the last four out of his five matches against Kerala Blasters FC.

Chennaiyin FC's Wilmar Jordan Gil has attempted more headed shots (10) than any other player in the league in 2024-25. Kerala Blasters FC will hence have to be wary of the aerial prowess of the opposition.

Kane score Hat-trick against Munich and fastest to 50 Bundesliga goals

games and also ensured the German giants remain unbeaten in the league with nine wins and two draws from their 11 games.

IPS officer turned corporate lawyer Y P Singh says that It is a settled position in Administrative Law and it is that if there is presence of particular person in a statutory body, who may appear to have any conflict of interest, then the decision of the statutory body gets vitiated because there is always a possibility of an indirect or direct influence in the minds of the majority decision makers.

To reiterate, the position of law is that even if there is any possibility of any such influence, even if there is no influence, yet the decision of the statutory body shall get vitiated. This principle emanates from the dictum – justice should not only be done but also seen to be done,



said Singh.

Thus, the presence of Srini-

Closer to their tech dreams: 276 students selected for Bharti Airtel scholarship

New Delhi: After the death of his father, Shikhar, who lives in Fatehpur, UP, had to grow up fast. A physical disability and mounting agricultural loans only added to this pressure. He focused on his education, and today, has been admitted to a computer science degree at National Institute of Technology, Karnataka. Thanks to the new Bharti Airtel Scholarship, his studies have been fully funded, and his dream to uplift his community using technology is more accessi-

Going beyond their original plan to award 250 students from across country, Bharti Airtel Foundation has given a full scholarship to 276 students pursuing technology courses at top 50 NIRF engineering institutions in India.

The students are from diverse socio-economic backgrounds. Among them are Jharkhand-based Ashna Noor, who aspires to start an NGO for girls in her village, and Mohit Gangwar, who



hopes to support his homemaker mother and father who suffers from paralysis.

Rakesh Bharti Mittal, vice-chairman of Bharti Enterprises, says the scholarship stemmed from a desire to expand the foundation's work in education.

"When we were thinking about what we should look at next, the idea that came to my mind was that there are so many children who don't pursue higher education because their parents have financial constraints. The gross enrollment rate for technology-related higher education is hardly 30%." he says.

As many as 22% of this year's Bharti scholars are girls. "We have been focused on bringing more girls into higher education because that is something that has been missing for a long time. When we're talking of a country which wants to take a leadership role in technology globally - in space, in semiconductors, in renewable energy

- why should the girls be left behind," asks Mittal.

The foundation has long worked on education, from launching 64 Satya Bhart Schools to a 'Quality Support Programme' that has helped 1,000 schools improve infrastructure and technology access Speaking of the importance of philanthropic interventions in education sector, Mittal says, "If vou're educated, vour life, your family, your future generation and the country benefits.'
