Maharashtra Opposition alleges Rs 3000-Crore scam, preference for Megha Engineering

Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) leaders staged a protest at the legislature Maharashtra complex today, on the third day of the monsoon session.

The opposition shouted slogans standing on the steps of the Vidhan Bhavan (Maharashtra legislature complex building) here, Fadnavis government of favouring a private company called Engineering Megha Infrastructure Ltd which had bagged a major tunnel project in Thane, and alleging that the deal involved a Rs 3,000-crore scam.

"Megha Engineering and Infrastructure the government's favourite contractor," and "Megha gets the cream while farmers remain hungry," were some of the slogans shouted by MVA opposition leaders.

MVA opposition MLAs and Members of Legislative Council (MLCs) also shouted slogans alleging

"Despite serious concerns being raised about the project, the government continued to push it.

This is not merely a technical lapse. It is a Rs 3,000-crore scam which the people of Maharashtra must not ignore," Danve said.

Congress MLA Satej Patil alleged that the Megha Engineering which won the contract was a buyer of electoral bonds. "This is not government is rewarding the same company from which it received kickbacks, This raises fundamental questions implemented.

This led to Speaker Rahul Narvekar asking Minister Rathod to give a proper answer to Mungantiwar's question

Finally, Rathod said, 'We will survey such drains. We will check the width of the drains and examine if they need to be widened. Opposition Walks Out Twice Over Surge in Farmer Suicides in Maharashtra

Mumbai: Tensions ran high in the Maharashtra Legislative Assembly on Wednesday as the Opposition staged two walkouts, accusing the state government of ignoring the worsening agrarian crisis. The protest was sparked by a sharp rise in farmer suicides, with 767 cases reported January and March 2025, and widespread dissatisfaction over pending payments to soybean and cotton growers.

Senior Congress leader Vijay Wadettiwar raised the issue through an adjournment motion, highlighting that 200 of the suicide cases were deemed ineligible compensation, while 194 remained under investigation. He criticized the government for prioritizing infrastructure spending over farmer welfare, pointing to the recent ₹20,000 crore allocation for the Shaktipeeth Mahamarg project, while loan waivers remain unfulfilled.

Wadettiwar also slammed ministers for making derogatory remarks against farmers and questioned the delay in providing promised one-and-a-half times the support price for crops. He cited a tragic case from Latur, where a 65-year-old farmer reportedly yoked himself to a plough, reflecting the dire state of agriculture. Despite being allowed to

voice their concerns, the Speaker, Rahul Narwekar, rejected the adjournment notice and deferred the discussion to Thursday. This led to loud protests and walkouts by members of the Congress, Shiv Sena (UBT), and NCP (SP), who accused the government of being apathetic and politically evasive. Deputy Chief Minister

Ajit Pawar dismissed the Opposition's allegations, saying the government was open to debate and committed to addressing farmers' issues. However, the Opposition remained unconvinced, also expressing anger over nonpayment to soybean farmers Vidarbha, government claims of Direct Benefit Transfers.

Unsatisfied with the response from Agriculture and Marketing Minister Jaikumar Opposition walked out again, demanding immediate and concrete action.

Over ₹22,500 Crore Lost by 1.5 Crore Investors in Maharashtra Over a Decade: CM Fadnavis

Mumbai: Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis revealed that more than 1.5 crore investors outside Mumbai have fallen investment schemes over the past 10 years, resulting in a staggering loss of ₹22,552 crore. This data was shared during the state legislative council session on Wednesday, highlighting the growing menace of financial and cyber fraud.

Fadnavis, who also holds the Home portfolio, noted that in Mumbai alone, the Economic Offences Wing reported that 2.71 lakh people were cheated out of ₹2.95 lakh crore in similar scams over the same

New Delhi: A day after Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah linked heartrelated deaths in Hassan district to Covid vaccine, the Union Health Ministry today rebut his claims saying that extensive studies by ICMR and AIIMS have conclusively found no such connections.

Siddaramaiah had on Tuesday said "hasty approval and distribution" of the Covid vaccine to the public could also be a reason for these deaths and urged everyone to visit the nearest health centre immediately for a check-up if they have symptoms such as chest pain or difficulty breathing, and not to ignore these signs.

trashed his observation, saying that the matter of sudden unexplained deaths has been investigated through several agencies in the country and these studies conclusively established that there is no direct link between Covid-19 vaccination and reports of sudden deaths.

However, the Ministry

The Ministry studies by the ICMR and National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) saying that they have affirmed that Covid-19 vaccines in India are safe and effective, with extremely rare instances of

serious side effects. Sudden cardiac deaths can result from a wide range of factors, including genetics, lifestyle, pre-existing conditions, and post-Covid complications, the Ministry said in a statement.

The ICMR and NCDC have been working together to understand the causes behind sudden unexplained deaths, especially in young adults between the ages of 18 and 45 years. To explore this, two

complementary studies were undertaken using different research approaches -- one based on past data and another involving real-time investigation.

The first study was ÍCMR's conducted by

Institute Epidemiology (NIE) was titled "Factors associated with unexplained sudden deaths among adults aged 18-45 years in India - a multicentric matched case control study," from May to August 2023 across 47 tertiary care hospitals in 19 states and Union territories, statement said. It looked at individuals

who appeared to be healthy but died suddenly between October 2021 and March 2023. The findings have conclusively showed that Covid-19 vaccination does not increase the risk of unexplained sudden deaths in young adults.

The second study titled "Establishing the cause in sudden unexplained deaths in young" is currently being conducted by the AIIMS, Delhi. This is a prospective study aimed at determining the common causes of sudden deaths in young adults. "Early analysis of data from the study indicates that heart attacks or myocardial infarction (MI) continue to be the leading cause of sudden death in this age group," the

Importantly, no major changes in the pattern of causes have been observed compared when previous years.

In majority of the

unexplained death cases, genetic mutations have been identified as a possible cause of these deaths. The final results will be shared once the study is complete. Together, these two

studies offer a more comprehensive understanding of sudden unexplained deaths in young adults in India. It has also been found that Covid-19 vaccination does not appear to increase the risk, whereas, the role of underlying health issues, genetic predisposition and risky lifestyle choices does play a role in unexplained sudden deaths, the statement said.

Without naming the State

Karnataka Minister's statement on doubting vaccine's efficiency, the statement said "Scientific experts have reiterated that statements linking COVID vaccination to sudden deaths are false and misleading, and are not

consensus. "Speculative without conclusive evidence risk undermining public confidence in vaccines, which have played a crucial role in saving millions of lives during the pandemic. Such unfounded reports and could strongly claims contribute vaccine hesitancy in the country, thereby adversely impacting public health." The Karnataka chief

minister had said more than 20 people have died due to heart attacks in the past month alone in just one district of Hassan. In a post on X, he wrote: "The government is taking this matter very seriously. To identify the exact cause of these series of deaths and to find solutions, a committee of experts has been formed under the leadership of Dr Ravindranath, Director of Jayadeva Institute of Cardiovascular Sciences and Research, and they have been instructed to submit a study report within 10 days."

Puri: Preparations for the Bahuda Yatra (return car festival) of the holy Trinity of the Sri Jagannath Temple began today.

According to tradition, on the fifth day of the Rath Yatra, Mahalaxmi - the consort of Lord Jagannath upset over being left behind during the journey to Gundicha Temple, arrived there Tuesday night in a ceremonial procession. The ritual was conducted by servitors and priests, with the goddess carried in a decorated palanquin.

arrival, Upon entered the procession Gundicha Temple. From a distance, standing at the Jai Vijaydoors of the Jagamohan, Mahalaxmi caught a glimpse of Lord Jagannath and symbolically ordered his return to the main temple.

Her Ajnamallya (divine order) was handed over to Lord Jagannath's servitors, directing them to make arrangements for the return journey. On her way back, she ritually damaged a piece of the Nandighosh chariot of Lord Jagannath - a symbolic act steeped in tradition.

Monsoon fury in Mandi: 10 dead, 34 missing amid landslides & cloudbursts

Mandi district due to landslides and multiple cloudburst incidents on July 1 has risen to 10, while 34 people remain missing, according to the latest report issued by the Himachal Pradesh State Emergency Operation Centre.

The monsoon fury, which been consistently wreaking havoc in the state for the past three years, has again brought devastation to several regions of Mandi, especially in the subdivisions of Karsog, Thunag, Padhar and Gohar. Between June 20 and July 1, the state has reported around 90 people either killed or missing in weather-related

According to the 32-hour situation report released at 8 am on July 2, 10 deaths were

Shimla: The death toll in confirmed from various parts of Mandi. As many as 34 people are officially reported missing; many are feared



trapped under debris or washed away by flash floods. Five people have sustained injuries, and over 370 have been rescued or evacuated, with 11 still stranded.

Rescue teams from NDRF and SDRF have been deployed at Karsog, Gohar, and Thunag, where severe cloudbursts caused destruction of homes and public infrastructure.

Among the

affected areas are Siyani, Gohar reported 9 people washed away, with 2 bodies

recovered and 7 still missing. Parwara and Talwara village reported two missing from a family, with one body recovered.Thunag Pakrair areas together account for 17 missing and two deaths.

Several locations including Kutti Bypass, Old Bazaar Karsog, and Bada in Gohar also reported fatalities and multiple missing cases.

Highway-305 blocked, and damage reported to 24 houses, 12 cowsheds, and one hydroelectric project, the state continues to grapple monsoon-triggered with destruction. Relief operations are underway but hampered by accessibility challenges in hilly terrains.

The primary stretch of the subway will span 1 kilometer with a width of 7.5 meters, connecting the Nehru Science Centre exit of the Acharya Atre Chowk Metro station to Mahalaxmi Racecourse. A 120-meter branch will extend from this main passage. The BMC is considering two design options: one that directly con-

Suicide Note Alleges Financial Fraud, **Leads to FIR Against Four in Mumbai**

Mumbai: The suicide of a 29-yearold man in Mankhurd has prompted an FIR against four individuals, including a bank officer, after a suicide note surfaced alleging financial fraud and cheating. Tauhid Ahmed Khan, who worked at a glass shop, was found dead by hanging in his shop on June 7, 2025.

His brother discovered a suicide note on the shop's computer the following day, which blamed several people for his financial ruin. The note specifically names Narayana Lal Devda, his wife Chanda Devi, their associate Naresh Kumar Teli, and Bank of Baroda officer Jyotsna Jag-

According to the complaint filed by Tauhid's father, Taufiq Khan, the accused allegedly defrauded Tauhid of ₹14 lakh. The suicide note details several grievances, including his bank account being frozen without notice and unexplained losses from his shop. It also mentions a ₹42,000

loss due to a fraudulent Telegram link. Tauhid had reportedly paid ₹8.5 lakh

to Narayana Devda for two rental properties under leave-and-license agreements, but he never received possession. One of these properties was allegedly sublet illegally, and rent payments ceased. The



accused then reportedly vacated the area and became unreachable, pushing Tauhid into depression.

Taufiq Khan has submitted transaction details and the suicide note to the police, demanding action against those named. The Mankhurd police have registered an FIR under the BNS section for abetment to suicide, and further investigation is underway.

Shaikh even took the minor to Nepal, aware that Nepalese police do not share mobile network details with Indian authorities. After a brief stay, they moved to West Bengal. The crucial breakthrough

"He abandoned his mobile. This made it difficult to track his location. Later, we learned that he communicated with his family members only using internet calling," a police officer stated. The police team, led by DCP Manish Kalwaniya, including ACP Prakash Chougule, Senior Inspector Ramesh Wagh, Inspector Yuvraj Khade, Sub-Inspectors Sudarshan Bankar, Shailesh Chaudhary, and Vishal Daundkar, invested ₹30,000 to develop a human intelligence network and acquire the necessary technology to outsmart Shaikh, who worked as a fire alarm technician and was

During the extensive search, police discovered Shaikh traveled to Uttar Pradesh, Delhi, Nepal, and finally to his maternal relatives in West Bengal. Shaikh's family in Bandra (East) reportedly did not cooperate with the in-

A prior tip-off in May led a team led by Sub-Inspector Bankar to Malda in West Bengal, but they returned without locating him. Subsequently, another lead emerged: Shaikh was using Instagram. "This was the first lead which helped the team track down the internet protocol address and the mobile device details that he used to access Instagram and also the Gmail account he logged into

shown in West Bengal," the officer explained.

Upon reaching West Bengal, the police employed decoy tactics. With local assistance, they managed to get Shaikh to a gas agency for a KYC update, where he submitted his new mobile number to obtain a gas cylinder. An officer revealed that Shaikh and the minor "traveled without tickets on trains and buses and frequently changed his location of stay during the five months of elopement. He used to do odd jobs to earn a livelihood."

The minor's parents had also filed for habeas corpus in court, alleging that the police were not treating the case seriously.

Carnac Bridge Sees Early Use, Awaits Official Opening

Mumbai : Mumbai's new Carnac Bridge, linking P D'mello Road and Mohammad Ali Road, is already being used by two-wheelers and pedestrians despite not being officially open.

Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) is awaiting a formal nod from Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, with officials optimistic about an opening within

The BMC plans a public opening without a formal ceremony, similar to the Vikhroli bridge. The bridge has successfully completed load tests and secured a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the Railways.

All necessary files have been submitted, and the BMC is simply waiting for the final order. Unofficial usage was

observed on Monday, with two-wheelers and pedestrians utilizing the bridge to save time. Once officially opened, the Carnac Bridge is expected to significantly ease traffic congestion on the busy P D'mello Road and Mohammad Ali The ₹60 crore proj-

ect replaced a British-era bridge demolished in November 2022. Reconstruction was completed on June 10, with load tests on June 15, and the railway NOC received on June 24.

Mumbai Teacher and Friend Arrested for Allegedly **Grooming and Sexually Assaulting Teenage Boy**

teacher from a prominent Central Mumbai school and her friend have been arrested by Dadar police on charges of sexually assaulting a teenage male student for a year. The 38-year-old teacher, who i s married with children, reportedly groomed the minor by offering emotional support, taking him to luxury hotels, and providing him with alcohol and anxiety medication. Police stated that the survivor, now 17, initially met the teacher through school extracurricular activities, including dance groups she organized. Over time, the accused allegedly gained his trust and isolated him from his peers.

She would reportedly pick him up from secluded locations in her sedan—which has since been seized by police—and take him to five-star hotels where the alleged abuse took place. Investigators revealed that the teacher administered anxiety pills without medical supervision and gave the boy alcohol.

The survivor confided a close female friend in early 2025, who encouraged him to inform a school counselor. Upon being notified, the school management immediately reported the incident to the police. During questioning, the boy disclosed that he had remained silent for months, hoping the teacher would

stop the abuse, but eventually spoke out due to emotional distress and anxiety. He lodged a formal complaint after passing out of

The teacher and her friend were arrested last week and have been remanded in police custody. They face multiple charges under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act. 2012. including sections 376 (rape), 328 (causing hurt by poison), 506 (criminal intimidation), and 34 (common intent) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC).

Police are currently reviewing the teacher's past interactions with other students and examining her

digital footprint for potential evidence of grooming or inappropriate conduct. A senior investigating officer stated, "The accused projected herself as a mentor, but used her position of trust to exploit a vulnerable minor. This is a serious breach of professional and moral boundaries.'

The school has suspended the teacher and issued a statement confirming their full cooperation with law enforcement and expressing support for the

Kandivali Police Bust 'Jamtara' Cyber Fraud Ring in Mumbai, Seize 56 ATM Cards

Mumbai: In a significant operation, the Kandivali Police have successfully apprehended three cybercriminals hailing from Jamtara district in Jharkhand, a region notorious as India's hub for online fraud. The arrests were made while the accused were in Mumbai to withdraw money obtained through illicit online scams. Authorities have seized a substantial haul, including 56 ATM cards, eight mobile phones, and ₹90,000 in cash from their possession.

The arrested individuals have been identified as Mohammad Imran Ansari (36), Ali Uddin Sarfuddin Ansari (34), and Rajkumar Madhuban Prasad (33). According to Kandivali Police Senior Inspector Ravi Adane, the trio has admitted to their involvement in numerous cyber fraud cases spanning across the country.

Acting swiftly on this tip-off, a team led by Inspector Harish Gawli and Assistant Inspector Deepak Kadbane raided a hotel in Kandivali, leading to the apprehension of the suspects. Investigators have shed light on the common modus operandi of these cyber fraudsters, who typically avoid using their own bank accounts to receive money. Instead, they operate

accounts opened either fraudulently using other individuals' documents or by enticing people with promises of commission. Many of these accounts are reportedly opened using Aadhaar card details without the actual person's knowledge.

In recent years, hundreds of such bank accounts have reportedly been opened in Mumbai under the guise of government schemes like "Ladki Bahin Yojana," solely for the purpose of laundering proceeds from scams. Police anticipate that further interrogation of the accused will likely expose several other intricate cyber fraud networks operating nationwide. The successful operation was conducted under the guidance of Senior Inspector Ravi Adane, with key contributions from Inspector Harish Gawli, API Deepak Kadbane, PSI Shrikant Magar, and ASI Sharad Gavkar.



Mumbai: The Bombay High Court on Tuesday, July 1, 2025, declined to intervene in the Maharashtra state government's decision to establish a memorial for the late Shiv Sena chief Balasaheb Thackeray at the Mayor's Bungalow in Shivaji Park.

Chief Justice Alok Aradhe and Justice Sandeep Marne dismissed four Public Interest Litigations (PILs), stating, "We do not find that any valid ground of challenge is made out." Senior advocates Sunip Sen and Uday Warunjikar, representing two petitioners, clarified that their clients were not opposed to a memorial for Thackeray. However, they challenged the chosen site, the shifting of land reservation, the composition of the trust, and the nominal annual rent of Re 1 for land valued at hundreds of crores.

The judges ruled that the state government's choice of site, approved by the landowner BMC, "would undoubtedly fall in the realm of policy" and "outside scope of judicial review." They noted that the decision, which came after more than a year of deliberations based on a high-powered committee's recommendations, was "well-considered." Regarding the land use, the court observed that the only change in the Development Plan (DP) was the alteration of the label from 'mayor's bungalow' to 'Balasaheb Thackeray Rashtriya Smarak' and

the deletion of the green zone, substituted by a residential zone. The judges found no "procedural impropriety" as these changes were effected after following due procedure under the Maharashtra Regional and Town Planning Act. The court also found no "arbitrariness" in the government's decision to include three members from the political party and two from Thackeray's family on the board of trustees, given that the memorial is intended to honor Thackeray.

The contention regarding a valuable piece of land being offered to the trust virtually free of cost "does not appeal," the judges stated. "Any piece of land in the city of Mumbai is bound to be valuable and therefore it is not for this court to decide which land needs to be chosen for setting up the memorial...," the court said, clarifying that the BMC would retain ownership of the land leased to the trust for 30 years.

The judges further noted that work on the memorial is "virtually complete by now." Based on pictures submitted by senior advocate Darius Khambata and advocate Joel Carlos, representing the Balasaheb Thackeray Memorial Public Trust, the court observed that the "grandiose structure of mayor's bungalow has not only been kept intact, but has been restored," ensuring its "heritage significance is not disturbed."

Maharashtra Governor Mandates Biometric **Attendance for College Staff and Students**

Mumbai: In a move aimed at addressing concerns over dwindling attendance, Maharashtra Governor C. P. Radhakrishnan, who serves as the chancellor of public universities in the state, has directed all vice-chancellors to implement mandatory biometric attendance for both staff and students across universities and their affiliated colleges. This directive was reported by Yogita Rao.

While college principals acknowledge the need to tackle falling attendance, they foresee significant challenges in enforcing such a comprehensive system.

Following the Governor's instruction, Mumbai University issued a circular on June 24, mandating biometric attendance for its staff and linking salaries to it. This particular decision has met with opposition from university staff. However, the university has yet to issue any similar directive specifically

The Governor's directive em-

phasizes the importance of regular attendance monitoring. Currently, many universities utilize biometric systems for teaching and non-teaching staff, but no such arrangement is

Public universities in Maharashtra have not yet issued circulars to enforce the Governor's mandate for students. One vice-chancellor described the issue as "sensitive." A city college principal confirmed having a biometric system for campus entry but not for attendance in individual lectures.

"The implementation will be challenging," remarked a principal, highlighting that "the university will not be able to monitor the functioning of around 900 colleges." The principal also noted that many colleges have struggled to enforce the existing 75% attendance norms, with only a few strictly adhering to the rules.

Another principal pointed out a fundamental data gap: universities do not have comprehensive infor-

mation on the number of teachers in affiliated colleges. "Aided colleges still have some structured systems in place, at least for the aided courses, but many unaided colleges run without any consistent regulation," the principal added.

An educationist,

anonymously, suggested that a stringent directive from the government is the only way to resolve the issue. "The government should enforce the attendance norms through the universities and instruct them to take stringent action against colleges flouting norms," the educationist stated. They further recommended that "Universities should be asked to set up flying squads to conduct surprise checks to find out if lectures are being conducted. If students are not attending lectures, they should be debarred from exams." The educationist concluded by emphasizing that this is a systemic problem requiring collective effort from multiple stakeholders.

Ivory Walking Stick Worth ₹10 Lakh Seized in Ghatkopar, Two Arrested

Mumbai: In a joint operation, the Crime Branch Unit 5 of Kurla, Mumbai, and the Forest Department have successfully apprehended two individuals for the illegal possession of a intricately carved ivory walking stick. The artifact is estimated to be worth approximately ₹10 lakh in the international market. The arrests took place on July 1, 2025, around 7:00 PM, near Sarvodaya Hospital, under the Metro Bridge on LBS Road in Ghatkopar (West), Mumbai. According to Crime Branch offi-

cials, Assistant Police Inspector Dhanraj Chaudhary received confidential intelligence indicating that two individuals would arrive at the specified location to sell the illicit ivory artifact. Acting on this crucial tip-off, and under the guidance of senior officers, the Crime Branch promptly informed the Territorial Forest Officer (Wildlife) at Teen Hath Naka, Thane. Consequently, one officer and two forest staff members were deputed to assist in the operation. A coordinated team comprising officers from Crime Branch Unit 5 and forest officials then set up a trap at the designated spot. At approximately 7:00 PM, the two suspects weresuccessfully apprehended in possession of the carved ivory walking stick. The seized item and the two accused individuals have been handed over to Forest Circle Officer Janardan Bhosale, along with Forest Guards Vikram Pawar and Jyoti Bhosale, for further legal proceedings. An ongoing investigation is underway to delve deeper into the matter.

Yes Bank Fined ₹50,000 for Aadhaar-Related Delay in Account Opening

Mumbai: The Bombay High Court has ordered Yes Bank Ltd. to pay ₹50,000 in compensation to Microfibers Pvt Ltd. for an unreasonable delay in opening the company's bank account. This delay occurred despite the Supreme Court's September 2018 ruling that Aadhaar is not mandatory for this purpose. Microfibers Pvt Ltd. initially applied for an account in January 2018 but was unable to rent out its premises without an operational account. Yes Bank insisted on an Aadhaar card in April 2018, even after being informed of the Supreme Court's interim orders. After the company filed a High

Court petition, Yes Bank, in a June 2018 hearing, stated it would comply with the Supreme Court's definitive September 2018 judgment and open the account without insisting on Aadhaar. However, the account was not opened until Jan-

tendra Jain, in their June 26, 2025, ruling, noted the bank's failure to

file a reply and the three to fourmonth period the petitioner was unable to rent premises. While the High Court found the ₹10 lakh compensation claim "exaggerated," it directed Yes Bank to pay ₹50,000 within eight weeks, acknowledging the bank's continued insistence on Aadhaar after clear Supreme Court directives.

Railways' relief!

Good news for lakhs of passengers travelling by train! The Railway Administration has decided to put an end to the fear of reservations and the uncertainty of ticket confirmation till the last minute. From July 1, the reservation chart for long-distance trains will now be published 8 hours in advance, not 4. This will be a big relief for the passengers who are planning.

In the last few days, the Railway Board has made one or the other decision. Along with a slight increase in fares in long-distance mail-express trains, the Railway Administration has made important changes in the ticketing system. The most important and in the interest of the passengers is the decision to publish the reservation chart 8 hours before the departure of the train instead of 4 hours

Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnav recently approved the proposal of the Railway Board in this regard and this decision has been implemented across the country from July 1. Most passengers prefer railways for long-distance travel in India. Indian Railways also has its own glorious history and culture. The Indian Railways network, which extends over 65 thousand km, is considered the fourth largest railway network in the

Indian Railways embraces the bustling urban centers and remote villages. The train that connects various regions of the Indian subcontinent creates countless stories of travel as it runs forward. The railway, which is the first choice for cheap, fast and safe travel, also provides employment to millions of hands.

One or the other feature of Indian Railways can be mentioned. But, in the current situation, while providing services to the passengers, the railway administration has to face criticism on many issues. Reservation in trains is a key issue. A few days ago, train reservations were opened for passengers going to Konkan on the occasion of Ganeshotsav. As soon as this reservation started, it was filled in just 3 minutes.

This caused a lot of disappointment to the servants who had been planning to go to Konkan for the last one and a half to two months. Every year, lakhs of servants have to endure this pain. Our metropolis had stated that this was happening because the number of tickets for certain trains running on the Konkan Railway route was very insufficient. Any long-distance journey requires planning

Earlier, a train passenger could reserve a ticket for up to 120 days. The railway administration has reduced this limit by half and brought it to 60 days. Once a train ticket is reserved, the passenger's future plans are decided Some want to go to their hometown, while others just want to travel. Accordingly, passengers have to make arrangements for accommodation, food, and travel at the designated place. For this, the issue of confirming the reservation is very important.

Many people travel by train with their families and friends. There are also women, children, or the elderly, in such cases, a big problem arises if the ticket is not confirmed. Because the journey is long-distance. Another problem is that the ticket has been purchased by spending money and the journey has to be made. But since the ticket is not reserved, there is no place to sit. In such a case, passengers on the waiting list travel in AC or sleeper coaches and are caught in the clutches of ticket inspection, it is assumed that they will have to pay a huge fine.

Moreover, the passenger has to pay the entire journey fare between the station from which he travelled and the station at which he was caught. It is allowed to travel only in general coaches with a waiting ticket. But passengers should not tell a different story of the general coach which is always full. The railway administration has given some relief to the passengers stuck in such a dilemma.

Earlier, the reservation chart was prepared only 4 hours before the departure of the train, due to which the waiting ticket holders had to wait till the last minute for the ticket confirmation. Now the reservation chart will be prepared 8 hours before the departure of the train This will help reduce the uncertainty faced by the passengers in the waiting list. According to the new scheme the reservation chart for trains departing before 2 pm will be prepared at 9 pm the previous day.

The Indian Railways has also clarified that this change will be implemented in a phased manner to ensure that this process is carried out smoothly without any hindrance. Many passengers travel from remote areas and suburbs to reach important railway stations. Such passengers will know the status of their tickets 8 hours in advance. If necessary, such passengers will get more time to cancel the ticket or make alternative travel arrangements.

Apart from this, the railway administration is developing a modern passenger reservation system. The current system has the capacity to reserve 32 thousand tickets per minute. The new system will have the capacity to reserve 1.5 lakh tickets per minute. Similarly, the capacity of ticket enquiry will increase tenfold from 4 lakh to 40 lakh per minute. This modern passenger reservation system is expected to come into service by December

Not only this, from the end of July, Tatkal tickets will be reserved only after OTP-based authentication on the IRCTC website and app. The rail travel experience starts with ticket reservation. The steps taken by the railway administration to make the ticket booking process even easier and more transparent are certainly welcome. It is expected that if the fear of confirmed tickets is eliminated, the further train journey of the passengers will also be hassle-free.

The Railway Administration has taken important steps for the convenience of passengers, from technical improvements in the ticket reservation process, to increasing the ticket enquiry capacity and transparency in the reservation system. There is no doubt that these efforts to improve the travel experience will receive a very positive response from the passengers. There is no doubt that this improvement will be a relief for travel, there is no doubt about it!

First-Ever National Workshop on Pension Disputes

aimed at reducing pensionrelated legal disputes and ensuring swifter justice for India's growing population of retired government employees, Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh today, while chairing the first-ever "National Workshop on Pension Litigation" organized by the Department of Pension & Pensioners' Welfare at Vigyan Bhawan here, said that in no case should the vital energies of our elder citizens be allowed to be consumed inconsequentially for avoidable reasons because they may be "retired from government service but not retired from service to the nation"

Addressing a packed hall of senior officials, legal experts and pension administrators, Dr. Jitendra Singh underlined the Centre's firm commitment to pensioners' welfare, while also drawing attention to the mounting pressure on government finances due to litigation. He noted that with over 60 lakh pensioners today — a figure that now exceeds the number of serving Central Government employees — the challenges of pension administration have entered a new phase that requires urgent institutional coordination and systemic reforms.

"Pension-related litigation often arises from misinterpretation of rules, and unresolved grievances can lead to unnecessary hardship for senior citizens," Dr. Jitendra Singh said. Currently, over 300 pensionrelated cases are pending in various forums, with nearly 70% before Central Administrative Tribunals (CAT). The Minister acknowledged that the Government is impleaded in nearly all of these cases, indicating the systemic nature of the prob-

"Litigation is usually the last resort, not the first,' the Minister said, cautioning against underestimating the grievances of pensioners. He also reflected on how, in many cases, both winning and losing parties in tribunals often appeal further, underlining the depth of discontent and the

To address these concerns, the workshop focused on legal training for nodal officers, stronger real-time coordination with the Department of Legal Affairs, and the potential use of technology - including AI-driven dashboards and repositories to improve decision-making and case tracking.

However, Dr. Jitendra Singh emphasized that no algorithm can replace human empathy and administrative sensitivity. "AI can assist, but welfare must be guided by intelligence of the humane kind," he remarked.He ended on a poignant note, calling for a mindset shift in how retirees are viewed: "They may retire from government service, but not from serving the nation."

As part of the workshop



ter Dr. Jitendra Singh launched a set of key publications and initiatives aimed at enhancing awareness and grievance redressal mechanisms related to pension matters. These included a Compendium of Case Studies on Pension Litigation, a Flyer on Pension Litigation, and a Booklet on last year's Special Campaign on Family Pensioners' Grievances. He also formally launched the Special Campaign 2.0, a month-long nationwide drive dedicated to resolving pending grievances of family pensioners and super senior pensioners. These initiatives are expected to support capacity building, promote best practices, and

some of the most vulnerable sections among pensioners.

Joining the workshop virtually, Attorney General of India R. Venkataramani stressed the need for a structured national approach to litigation management, with a special focus on pension disputes. He proposed an ambitious target of achieving "zero pension litigation" by 2028 through anticipatory administrative measures, timely grievance resolution, and a culture of accountability. Emphasizing the unique nature of pension litigation compared to other service-related legal matters, he advocated for the adoption of mediation and conciliatory mechanisms as viable alternatives to adversarial proceedings. The Attorney General also highlighted chronic delays in processing pension claims — particularly for armed forces personnel — and called for the use of digital tools to improve real-time coordination between nodal officers, law officers, and his office. He proposed establishing a digitally connected standing platform to monitor and manage litigation across departments. "Pursuit of happiness," he said, "should extend to our retirees," urging all stakeholders to work collectively to ensure that pensioners are not left to navigate legal complexities in their twilight years. Earlier in the day, Secretary of the De-

Pensioners' Welfare, V. Srinivas, outlined the rationale behind convening the National Workshop, stating that the initiative was conceived to strengthen the capacities of nodal officers, streamline administrative processes, and reduce avoidable pension-related litigation. He emphasized the need to address recurring legal disputes, eliminate anomalies in notifications, avoid contempt cases. and build a robust knowledge management system. Highlighting recent reforms, Secretary pointed to the launch of the CCS Pension Rules, NPS Rules, and Extraordinary Pension Rules in 2021 as key legislative milestones. He noted the digital empowerment of pensioners, including the integration of pension portals with banks and the submission of over 4.6 crore Digital Life Certificates. Citing the Department's experience of being party to nearly 6,000 pension-related court cases, he stressed the urgency of efficient legal coordination and earlystage policy vetting. The Secretary also announced upcoming initiatives, including inter-ministerial consultations on the CCS Unified Pension Scheme Rules 2025 and a monthlong national family pension awareness campaign starting July 1.

The plenary session of the workshop was graced by a distinguished panel of dignitaries, including Sec-(Ex-Servicemen Welfare), Dr. Niten Chandra; Secretary (Law), Dr. Anju Rathi Rana; Learned Additional Solicitor General. Shri Vikramjit Banerjee; Member (A), CAT Delhi, Dr. Chhabilendra Roul; and Joint Secretary (Pension), Shri Dhrubajyoti Sengupta.

Lifestyle and Pre-Existing Conditions identified as key factors

The matter of sudden unexplained deaths has been investigated through several agencies in the country. These studies have conclusively established that there is no direct link between COVID 19 vaccination and the

reports of sudden deaths in the country. Studies by the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) affirm that COV-ID-19 vaccines in India are safe and effective, with extremely rare instances of serious side effects. Sudden cardiac deaths can result from a wide range of factors, including genetics, lifestyle, pre-existing conditions, and post-COVID complications.

The ICMR and NCDC have been working together to understand the causes behind sudden unexplained deaths, especially in young adults between the ages of 18 and 45 years. To explore this, two complementary

studies were undertaken using different research approaches—one based on past data and another involving real-time investigation. The first study, conducted by ICMR's National Institute of Epidemiology (NIE), was titled "Factors associated with unexplained sudden deaths among adults aged 18-45 years in India – A multicentric matched case-control study." This study was carried out from May to August 2023 across 47 tertiary care hospitals in 19 states and Union Territories. It looked at individuals who appeared to be healthy but died suddenly between October 2021 and March 2023. The findings have conclusively showed that COVID-19 vaccination does not increase the risk of unexplained sudden death in young adults.

The second study, titled "Establishing the cause in sudden unexplained deaths in young," is currently being conducted by the

All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AI-IMS), New Delhi with funding and in collaboration with ICMR. This is a prospective study aimed at determining the common causes of sudden deaths in young adults. Early analysis of data from the study indicates that heart attacks, or myocardial infarction (MI), continue to be the leading cause of sudden death in this age group. Importantly, no major changes in the pattern of causes have been observed when compared with previous years. In majority of the unexplained death cases, genetic mutations have been identified as a possible cause of these deaths. The final results will be shared once the study is com-

Together, these two studies offer a more comprehensive understanding of sudden unexplained deaths in young adults in India. It has also been revealed that COVID-19 vaccination does not appear to increase the risk, whereas, the role of underlying health issues, genetic predisposition and risky lifestyle choices does play a role in unexplained sudden deaths.

Scientific experts have reiterated that statements linking COVID vaccination to sudden deaths are false and misleading, and are not supported by scientific consensus. Speculative claims without conclusive evidence risk undermining public confidence in vaccines, which have played a crucial role in saving millions of lives during the pandemic. Such unfounded reports and claims could strongly contribute to vaccine hesitancy in the country, thereby adversely impacting public health.

The Government of India remains committed to evidence-based public health research to protect the well-being of its citizens.

Maharashtra cyber heist: Crypto trader held in Rs 2 crore fake WhatsApp boss scam

Mumbai: The Maharashtra Nod-Cyber Police arrested a 27-yearold cryptocurrency trader from Sonipat in Haryana for his role in a cyber fraud.Scammers impersonated the Managing Director of an electronics company on WhatsApp and tricked the company's accountant into urgently transferring Rs 2 crore for a fake project. The money was routed through 13 layers of bank accounts, crypto exchanges, and cash handlers to evade detection.

The complainant, an account manager at an electronics manufacturing firm, filed the complaint after being duped into transferring large sums of company funds to fraudulent

accounts between April 10 and April

A message from a WhatsApp number bearing the photo of the company's director asked to urgently process RTGS payments for supposed project and legal expenses. Believing the number belonged to his boss, the accountant transferred ₹95 lakh to PR Education & Immigration Pvt Ltd and ₹95 lakh to AK Infra (ICICI Bank Account).

A third attempted transaction of ₹90 lakh to "Rajanandani Jewellers" was halted after the victim became suspicious and called his boss, who denied any such instructions. By then, the damage was done, and

₹1.90 crore was already transferred from the company's account. The firm then lodged an FIR, and

police started an investigation.

During the course of the investigation, it was revealed that the funds moved through a complex 13-layered laundering network, beginning with accounts belonging to Aksha (AK Infra) and then into 34 different bank accounts.

From the AK Infra account, ₹19 lakh was traced to a Punjab National Bank account held by Nisha Rana Rathi in Greater Noida. She withdrew the amount in cash and deposited it into Spice Money Company's account, a financial tech platform.

Builder Booked for Unauthorised Construction, **Assault in Bhandup Redevelopment Project**

based developer and his associates are facing serious legal action follow-

A complaint by the Slum Rehabilitation Authority (SRA) over unauthorised construction and structural violations at a redevelopment site in Bhandup (West).

The project, located at Aniraj Tower, has now become the centre of a major controversy involving not only planning breaches but also alleged assault.

A formal complaint was filed at the Bhandup police station by Laxmikant Manekar, an Assistant Engineer with the SRA, against Sudhanshu Infrastructure Pvt. Ltd., including its representative Abhayjit Dubey, for flouting urban development norms under the Maharashtra Regional and Town Planning (MRTP) Act, 1966.

According to the FIR, the developer illegally modified the building's approved layout by converting a designated shop on the 8th floor into a hall without seeking necessary approvals. Additionally.

Possession was allegedly handed over for several commercial units across the 1st to 8th floors despite the absence of fire safety clearance and Occupation Certifi-

cates (OC). The project, involving redevelopment of an older structure demolished over six years ago, has been under scrutiny after repeated complaints from society members about procedural violations. Despite multiple notices issued by the SRA — beginning 22 January 2025, followed by enforcement actions under Sections 53(1), 53(6), and 53(7) of the MRTP Act — the builder failed to comply or provide adequate explanation.

In a blatant act of defiance, the developer is accused of tampering with the seal placed by the authorities on 6 June, reopening the unauthorised space by breaking through a wall and constructing a new entrance. Mumbai Police Spend Six Months, ₹30,000 to **Nab Elopement Accused in Cross-State Chase**

Mumbai: What started as a seemingly routine case of a minor girl allegedly eloping with a 19-yearold quickly spiraled into a complex, tech-savvy game of hide-and-seek across multiple states — and even Nepal. The Mumbai Police finally arrested the accused, Samir Shaikh, from West Bengal after a six-monthlong manhunt that cost the department approximately ₹30,000 in expenses on logistics, technology, and in-

The case originated on January 6, when the parents of a 13-year-old girl from Mumbai Central filed a missing complaint at the Nirmal Nagar police station in Bandra (East). Her last known whereabouts were with Shaikh, a local youth from Behram Baug slum, with whom she had gone for a walk on January 5. Due to the girl's age, police registered a kidnapping

He ditched both his and the girl's mobile phones and communicated only via internet calling apps, keeping law enforcement off his trail. Investigators said he deliberately avoided mobile networks to avoid digital footprints and reportedly told others he knew that Nepal was outside the jurisdiction of Indian mobile surveillance.

The accused and the minor briefly stayed in Nepal, knowing Indian authorities couldn't access telecom data there, before moving back to West Bengal.

Police Track Gmail and Instagram Activity

The breakthrough came when Shaikh reportedly logged into his Gmail account, inadvertently giving investigators a digital trail. Later, usage of Instagram helped the cyber team identify an IP address and device details, finally pointing to his location in West With this lead, a team

of Mumbai police officers traveled to Malda and used decoy operations to apprehend Shaikh. Officers posed as gas agency staff offering a KYC update and lured him in when he attempted to book a cylinder using his new mobile number. Locals assisted in the operation.

Investigators revealed that Shaikh and the mi-

nor traveled extensively through Uttar Pradesh, Delhi, Nepal, and West Bengal, always avoiding consistent stays. He survived by doing odd jobs, traveling without tickets on buses and trains. and frequently changing residences to remain unde-

Despite multiple notices and even a habeas corpus plea filed by the girl's parents in court, progress had initially stalled due to Shaikh's tactics and lack of cooperation from his family. His relatives allegedly refused to share his whereabouts with the police.

The high-priority case was monitored by DCP Manish Kalwaniya and executed by a team comprising ACP Prakash Chougule, senior inspector Ramesh Wagh, inspector Yuvraj Khade, and sub-inspectors Sudarshan Bankar, Shailesh Chaudhary, and Vishal Daundkar, among others. A police officer said the

Enforce biometric attendance in colleges, guv tells state varsities

Mumbai: Governor C P Radhakrishnan, chancellor of public universities in the state, has asked all vice-chancellors to make biometric attendance mandatory for staff and students in universities as well as affiliated colleges, reports Yogita Rao.His directive comes amid concern over low attendance in colleges. While principals agree that falling attendance must be tackled, they say implementation of such a directive could be challenging.Mumbai University consequently issued a circular on June 24 for university staff and said that salaries would be linked to attendance. This has been opposed by university staff. It, however, hasn't issued any directive for students yet. The Governor's directive says attendance should be monitored regularly. While many universities use a biometric attendance system for teaching and non-teaching staff, no such arrangement has been introduced for stu-

Public universities in Maharashtra are yet to issue circulars to enforce the Governor's directive. One vice-chancellor termed it a 'sensitive' issue. A city college principal said they do have a biometric system for students entering the campus, but not for attendance in each lecture.

"The implementation will be challenging, the university will not be able to monitor the functioning of around 900 colleges. Moreover, colleges have failed to impose the 75% attendance norms. Barring a few colleges where the attendance rules are strictly followed, many are unable to get students to attend lectures," said the principal.

Another principal pointed out that the universities do not have data on the number of teachers in affiliated colleges. "Aided colleges still have some structured systems in place, at least for the aided courses, but many unaided colleges run without any consistent regulation," said the principal. An educationist, on con-

dition of anonymity, said the only way to fix the problem is a stringent directive from govt. "The govt should enforce the attendance norms through the universities and instruct them to take stringent action against colleges flouting norms. Universities should be asked to set up flying squads to conduct surprise checks to find out if lectures are being conducted. If students are not attending lectures, they should be debarred from exams," said the educationist, adding that it is a systemic problem and will take efforts from multiple stakeholders to resolve.

Poor England slump to second T20 defeat by India

round performance from England saw India take a 2-0 lead in the five-match T20 series with a convincing 24run win here.

England dominated the opening powerplay as India slipped to 31-3 - including Saturday's centurion Smriti Mandhana for 13 - but contributions of 63 apiece from Jemimah Rodrigues and Amanjot Kaur led a brilliant recovery to 181-4 on Tues-

The pair added 93 for the fourth wicket as England lost control of the middle overs, before Richa Ghosh's unbeaten 32 boosted the innings at the death.

In reply, England's alltoo-familiar batting frailties were exposed once again as they failed to recover from an early wobble to 17-3, eventually scrambling to 157-7 after Tammy Beaumont's 54 and a cameo of 35 from Sophie Ecclestone.

Openers Danni Wyatt-Hodge and Sophia Dunkley fell in the first two overs and captain Nat Sciver-Brunt was caught at mid-on for 13, before Beaumont's counterattacking knock kept England in the game with 106 needed from the final 10

But Beaumont's run-out in the 12th over shifted the game back in India's favour and Amy Jones - who added 70 for the fourth wicket with Beaumont and Alice Capsey both followed shortly after in the 15th, dismissed by the left-arm spin of Shree Charani.

Ecclestone's 23-ball knock ensured England fin-23-ball ished with some respectability but with many of the same mistakes repeated from the thrashing at Trent Bridge, the new leadership of Sciver-Brunt and Charlotte Edwards is being put to the test by a rapidly improving India who are building plenty of confidence going into their home 50-over World Cup in the autumn, according to a

If India's dominance at Trent Bridge was lit up by Mandhana's individual class, this innings required an allround team effort after their powerhouses - Mandhana herself and captain Harmanpreet Kaur, who was returning from injury, both fell

England experimented with Capsey's off-spin for the first over, which conceded 11, but seamers Lauren Bell and Lauren Filer dragged the control back brilliantly.



The latter dismissed Shafali Verma with an unplayable short ball that reared up and pinned the opener on the glove to be caught behind, Em Arlott had Mandhana well caught at mid-on by Bell before Harmanpreet pulled a poor delivery to short fine leg.

But Rodrigues, who came in at three, settled into her knock with exceptionally judged running between the wickets and putting the pressure on England's fielders before unveiling an array of ramps over the keeper and her movement around the crease completely threw England's bowlers off their

Amanjot took a backseat in the partnership, but when Rodrigues was dismissed thanks to Dunkley's flying catch at cover off Bell, Amanjot stepped up with her maiden T20 fifty and with Ghosh - who was inexplicably dropped by Beaumont on 12 - took the game away from England.

Bell was exceptional for her 2-17 but India were smart with their targets, taking 43 from Arlott's four overs, 42 from Filer's extra pace and Linsey Smith struggled again with 37 conceded from three wicketless overs.

Faced with a competitive total on a sluggish surface, there was a feeling of inevitability around how England's innings would unfold, and it started to unravel almost immediately.

Dunkley was run out at the end of the first over by Deepti Sharma before she then dismissed Wyatt-Hodge from the first ball of the second, bizarrely striking the ball straight to mid-off as the opener now has just one run from her past four T20 in-

Sciver-Brunt fell in the fourth over but Beaumont, recently recalled to the T20 side after a couple of years in and out, seemed to learn from India's batters and shifted around the crease efficiently to force the spinners off target with eight fours and a six, batting with her trademark swagger and a determined look to steer her side to victory.

But she was called through for a risky single from Jones, and Sneh Rana at point pulled off an exceptional piece of work to summarise India's noticeable improvement in the field, swooping and throwing in one movement while still on her knees, with bowler Radha Yadav whipping off the bails as Beaumont's fullstretch dive left her just short of her ground.

From there, it was a procession. Another soft dismissal for Capsey saw her chip Shree Charani to cover for five, Jones was caught and bowled four balls later and despite Ecclestone and Arlott's entertaining seventh-wicket stand of 47, the result was already a foregone

England are without Heather Knight's middle-order stability, but the repetitive manner of these defeats are a concern with the World Cup approaching and only three 50-over matches to come beforehand.

England captain Nat Sciver-Brunt said, "I thought we started off well in the powerplay with three wickets. Every bowler that came on was really focused on that but then they got a big partnership, which we didn't adapt to as quickly as we'd

"Some positives - Lauren Bell bowled a brilliant four overs and everyone really stuck to the task and tried to grind it out so the effort was really there."

India captain Harmanpreet Kaur said, "It was a good win for us. It's something special to see.

Mumbai: Indian equity benchmarks ended Wednesday's session in the red, weighed down by investor caution ahead of a critical US tariff deadline reaffirmed by President Donald Trump.

Elon Musk's Starlink Expands to Sri Lanka, Inches Closer to India Launch

Delhi: Musk's satellite-based internet venture, Starlink, officially commenced operations in Sri Lanka on Wednesday, marking another milestone in its South

Asian expansion. Sri Lanka becomes the third nation in the region following Bhutan and Bangladesh — to gain access to Starlink's satellite internet services. The development was announced by the company on X (formerly Twitter), where it shared: "Starhigh-speed, low-latency internet is now available in Sri Lanka!"

This move comes as Starlink edges closer to launching its services in India. Last month, the company secured a critical telecom license from India's Department of Telecommu-

nications (DoT), bringing it one step closer to rolling out operations nearly three years after submitting its initial applicatiThe final hurdle before Starlink can begin providing internet in India is formal clearance from the Indian National Space Promotion and Authorisation Centre (IN-SPACe). A draft Letter of Intent (LoI) has already been issued, and service activation is expected once both parties sign the agreement. Reports indicate that Starlink could go live in India within the next two months.Starlink delivers broadband connectivity through a network of low-Earth orbit satellites currently the largest such constellation in the world, with

over 6,750 active satellites. The service is designed to deliver high-speed internet with minimal latency, making it ideal for rural and remote regions where conventional broadband infrastructure is limited or un-

available. In Asia, Starlink is already operational in several countries, including Japan, Mongolia, the Philippines, Malaysia, Indonesia, Jordan, Yemen, and Azerbaijan. On a global scale, the company now serves users in over 100 countries, offering both fixed-location and mobile internet solutions.

Starlink's residential offerings are typically divided into two categories: Residential Lite, aimed at users with lower data consumption, and a standard Residential plan tailored for families or high-usage households.
